

DRCSC is a non-government development organization working in 12 districts of West Bengal and other states. Our major concern is food and livelihood security of the rural poor through sustainable management of natural resources on the basis of principles and actions, that are environment friendly, economically appropriate, socially just and developed by mutual cooperation.

Areas of Involvement

- 1. Enhancing production of food, fodder, fuel etc through training, demonstrations and collaborative field trials on sustainable utilisation of natural resources.
- 2. Assisting rural communities, especially social exclusion groups to conserve and regenerate common property resources like grazing lands, ponds & wetlands, roadside & canal bank/riverbank areas, permanent fallows etc. through group based management.
- 3. Enabling school teachers and educational workers to promote environmental awareness and activity based participatory learning among children and adolescents and to take up agro based enterprises.
- 4. Arranging and supporting documentation of overall developmental issues, rights, indigenous technologies & knowledge especially in the areas of food production & processing, seed selection & storage, nutrition & health care, water harvesting & storage etc.
- 5. Assisting and capacitating small organisations to develop and maintain libraries, documentation centres, seed centres & nurseries, revolving funds, grain banks, bio-labs, publication design & production units etc. and also to develop food security & environmental protection related projects.





Annual Report 2006-07

Our society has completed 25 years of work, this is both time for celebration and for reflection: 'India' has made much progress but 'Bharat' is often left behind.

In our search for sustainable development; development that meets the need of all but especially basic needs of the poor & marginalised; development that ensures equitable sharing of vital resources and development that minimises or even reverses environmental degradation; we design & implement various projects & programmes.

Highlights of these are presented here.

Improvement of Food & Livelihood security through sustainable resources management is one of our key objectives.



Our previous projects, SAN & PATHEYA were merged together & 'Sustainable Food & Livelihood Security Network project' supported by Christian Aid, was launched in October 2006 for a period of 3 years. This project operates through a network of NGOs & CBOs, most of which are now clustered into ARTCs (Area Resource & Training Centre), who are served by Zonal Resource & Training Centres of (ZRTCs).

These Centres provide trainings to farmers, supply seeds & bio-inputs if

needed & provides in formational services & technical Inputs. About 8 NGOs & 3 ZRTCs and 15 ARTCs provide support to around 200 villages with one or more groups, spread in 9 districts of West Bengal.

During the last year about 120 training sessions were organised and more than 1000



collaborative field trials were conducted on farmers' fields. About 50 intergroup exchange visits & study tours could also been organised.

Focus of these trials have been on introducing cropping systems & farming practices that increase food supply, extend growing season, conserve soil & water and generate additional employment.

Mutual cooperation groups have been created and trained to save money, operate own bank account, create revolving funds/seed banks, improve disaster preparedness by creating grain banks, harvesting & storing rainwater, planting strategic crops (mainly roots & tubers) designing fodder & fuelwood plantation etc. Many groups/subgroups have also strengthened or initiated income generation activities, after learning/improving their skills.



In collaboration with Panchayats, several groups have taken up tree plantation, improved water & sanitation etc.

To improve Food & Livelihood Security few micro projects were taken up to upscale previously tested technologies. From January 2007 3 new groups with 25 to 30 families each have come together to take up collective water harvesting & farm improvement projects in Puruliya District. The support for this project is provided by Karl Kubel Foundation of Germany. These projects have been appreciated by the Panchayats and in some cases supplimentary work was done through NREGS funds. The groups started last year have made good progress and contributed more resources than expected, by raising & selling tree seedlings etc. Revolving seed banks have also been created by 2 groups.



Our training division, which is funded through local donations, fees etc. have made good progress. We have organised skill trainings, conducted PRAs, provided technical advice, designed printed & audio visual materials for more than 30 clients during the year. Study tours for out of state & out of country groups of farmers, development workers etc. were also organised 6 times during the year.

Several trainings were organised in Shyamnagar & Bolpur training Centre & the training centre construction in Jhargram will be completed soon.

Another broad area of work in **environmental education** among middle-school & high school age children. Our projects aim at involving children in improving their environment through survey & action research.

The project ENRE (Ecology and Natural Resource Education) has now been extended to over 50 ecogroups and reach out to more than 750 children. This year the groups have done biodiversity survey of 20 villages and handed over the report to Gram Unnayan Samity & Panchayat.

The work with urban children now involves about 10 schools, where curriculum based activity oriented evs teaching learning mode are tried out. These activities are supported by the Indienhilfe group of Germany, Shapla Neer of Japan, Aeon Foundation, Japan.



For Non-school going children, part time nature study centres are run in about 20 areas. 12 of these groups are active and have taken up tree planting, waste based craft production, making palm juice, vermicomposting etc. which has improved their skills and generated income for their groups. We see more possibilities of developing income generation & other activities in future.

In some of our biodiversity documentation activities we have worked with other NGOs & resource centres & had received support from the Global Green Grants foundation based in Colorado, USA. Biodiversity register has been made in -- villages.

BIOMART, a bio input production and selling shops has been established in 8 location by rural unemployed youth, supported by DST, Government of India.

Supporting the creation & operation of 5 Multi purpose Education centres which involves preschool children, their mothers and sisters in Birbhum & Bankura district, mainly among ST communities. These works are supported by Ms Chiba & Aomori Bengal Association Japan, Affair Foundation Japan, WE 21 group Japan. Technical & Material support has been given by several Individuals & students of Aomori University, Mutsu Technical School etc.

We have been extending support to the Chetla Centre of Swanirvar for vocational education among slum children. Shapla Neer of Japan

supported this initiative. Funds from sale of 'Missing Peace' book was also used for this centre. Some of the book proceeds were

also shared with SILENCE, IPER, ANKURKALA; NGOs who facilitated study visit by TV stars from Japan, who came with Shapla Neer representatives.

We have published a set of posters, calender and film on

'Social Insects' with support from NCSTC, DST. Our environment education booklets have been reviewed by several magazines in India & abroad. We have collaborated with several initiatives organised by other NGOs of West Bengal & India in the field of environmental education & non formal / experiential education.

Apart from environment education booklets we also have a wide range of **publications** published by our centre.

This year also various publications, mainly in local language, published. We feel the need to consolidate our activities in this area as the need is enormous and resources can also be mobilised with some effort.





We have tried to capacitate grassroot organisation in documentation and information processing, 12 information peoples centres has started functioning, now, we have students/researchers in the form of library, meeting, seminars, newsletters etc. The centre has taken several initiatives to increase

cooperative activities with other Resource Centres in West Bengal through a forum ADDA.

There was a continuous effort from our resource centre to establish linkages between various networks like WBSHGPF, WBEN, RTI network etc.

'Sanbad Parisheba' - is an unique information service from our resource centre which provides newsclipping on development issues to grassroot newspapers. 250 newspapers are in thios network.


Creating opinion in favour of Sustainable Development models is another major concern of DRCSC. Towards this we undertake several activities. Some of the main initiatives are

All India Coordinated project on BIOFARM
 with support from DST, Govt of India, documents the cost benefit
 of Integrated Farming System both in economic & ecological terms
 throughout the length and breadth of the country involving 17
 organisations in 14 states.





 The centre has developed booklets on organic crop production in association with FAO & NCOF, New Delhi on organic practices of paddy, sesame, brinjal and taro. Four leaflets in local language were also brought out on the organic practices of same four crops.



DRCSC has also assisted **LIVING FARM**, a group in Orissa to promote Ecological Farming through trainings, publications etc. The work there is being supported through training assignments & grants from CONCERN, IGSSS, MCC etc. Several resource centres such as RCDC, SAMBHAV etc. have closely cooperated with us.



We participated and colaborated in local, state and national level fair / exhibition / seminars / workshops which includes Book Fair, Balvividha'06, Asian Biodiversity Convention, National Technology Congress, Biodiversity festival etc.
